

Dear Parishioners,

Though the Easter Cycle extends until the Divine Office of 'None' on Saturday, November 30, 2024, the

actual Easter Season is winding down, little by little. There will be a little "bump" in the road come the Vigil and Feast of the Ascension (thus inaugurating the "season" of Ascensiontide). While on that subject, please refer to the liturgical schedule for this week, paying particular attention to the Feast of the Ascension, Thursday, May 9. Yes, we normally have two Masses on Thursdays, but the Mass on Ascension Thursday evening, will be a <u>Sung Mass starting at 6:00</u> <u>PM</u>, not the usual 5:30 PM. Yes, Thursday of this week is the Feast of the Ascension. No power can change Ascension Thursday to Ascension Sunday. The Church, though, provides for this and similar delays by such things as an "external solemnity" or by a diocesan ruling that a weekday solemnity can take place on either the receding or following Sunday. In the <u>post Vatican II</u> "old days," as it always had been prior to that, Ascension Thursday used to be a Holy Day of Obligation. That changed sometime in the mid 80s.

Going on, Ascensiontide ends the day before Pentecost Sunday, i.e., the Vigil of Pentecost – as does, simultaneously, the Easter Season. Pentecost Sunday begins the First Class Octave of Pentecost and ends at the Divine Office hour of "None" Saturday, May 25. The next day, Sunday, the Feast of the Holy Trinity, begins the Post-Pentecost season (still in the Easter CYCLE, however). The extra 'Alleluias' disappear in the Mass and in the Divine Office and, on Sundays, the priest will vest in green. Along with the Post – Epiphany season, the Post – Pentecost season is the Extraordinary Form's equivalent of the Ordinary Form's 'Ordinary Time.'

I hope this lesson hasn't bored you so very much. But, it's important for us to know about our faith and liturgical practices.


